

Size Options for the Woven with Love Pattern

Large Quilt - finished size 58" x 68" 30 blocks set 5 blocks per row by 6 rows

Fabrics Required

Main Fabric	2 1/4 yards
(for block centers and border)	
First Accent Fabric	2 1/4 yards
(for Ribbon and Binding)	
Second Accent Fabric	7/8 yard
(for Ribbon)	
Backing	3 3/4 yards
Batting to fit	approx. 64" x 74"

Cutting

Of Main Fabric

- Cut 5 strips 6 1/2" wide.
- Cut 8 strips 4 1/2" wide for the border.

Of the First Accent Fabric:

- Cut 5 strips 10 1/2" wide. Cut these strips into 60 rectangles 2 1/2" x 10 1/2".
- Cut the remainder of this fabric into 2 1/2" strips (or your desired width) for the binding and set aside.

Of the Second Accent Fabric:

- Cut 10 strips 2 1/2" wide.

Make 30 blocks as indicated in the pattern. Lay out the blocks, 6 rows of 5 blocks each. Sew on the side borders first. They will measure 60 1/2". The top and bottom borders will measure 58 1/2".

Small Quilt - finished size 38" x 48" 12 blocks set 3 blocks per row by 4 rows

NOTE: The yardage given is for one quilt.

Fabrics Required

Main Fabric	1 yard
(for block centers and border)	
First Accent Fabric	1 yard
(for Ribbon and Binding)	
Second Accent Fabric	3/8 yard
(for Ribbon)	
Backing	1 1/2 yards
Batting to fit	approx. 44" x 54"

Cutting

Of Main Fabric

- Cut 2 strips 6 1/2" wide.
- Cut 4 strips 4 1/2" wide for the border.

Of the First Accent Fabric:

- Cut 2 strips 10 1/2" wide. Cut these strips into 24 rectangles 2 1/2" x 10 1/2".
- Cut the remainder of this fabric into 2 1/2" strips (or your desired width) for the binding and set aside.

Of the Second Accent Fabric:

- Cut 4 strips 2 1/2" wide.

Make 12 blocks as indicated in the pattern. Lay out the blocks, 4 rows of 3 blocks each. Sew on the side borders first. They will measure 40 1/2". The top and bottom borders will measure 38 1/2".

Two Small Quilts

NOTE: Making two small quilts of the same fabrics is the most efficient use of fabrics.

Fabrics Required

Main Fabric	2 yards
(for block centers and border)	
First Accent Fabric	1 1/2 yards
(for Ribbon and Binding)	
Second Accent Fabric	5/8 yard
(for Ribbon)	
Backing	3 yards
Batting to fit	2 pieces approx. 44" x 54"

Cutting

Of Main Fabric

- Cut 4 strips 6 1/2" wide.
- Cut 8 strips 4 1/2" wide for the border.

Of the First Accent Fabric:

- Cut 3 strips 10 1/2" wide. Cut these strips into 48 rectangles 2 1/2" x 10 1/2".
- Cut the remainder of this fabric into 2 1/2" strips (or your desired width) for the binding and set aside.

Of the Second Accent Fabric:

- Cut 8 strips 2 1/2" wide.

Make 24 blocks as indicated in the pattern. For each quilt lay out the blocks, 4 rows of 3 blocks each. Sew on the side borders first. They will measure 40 1/2". The top and bottom borders will measure 38 1/2".

Woven with Love - A Quilt for Charity

Fabrics Required

Finished block size -	10"
Finished quilt size -	48" x 58"
Main Fabric	1 3/4 yards (for block centers and border)
First Accent Fabric	1 1/2 yards (for Ribbon and Binding)
Second Accent Fabric	5/8 yard (for Ribbon)
Backing	3 yards
Batting to fit	approx. 54" x 64"

Cutting

Of Main Fabric

- Cut 4 strips 6 1/2" wide. Of one strip only cut two squares 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" and set the rest aside.
- Cut 6 strips 4 1/2" wide for the border.

Of the First Accent Fabric:

- Cut 3 strips 10 1/2" wide. Cut these strips into 40 rectangles 2 1/2" x 10 1/2".
- Cut the remainder of this fabric into 2 1/2" strips (or your desired width) for the binding and set aside.

Of the Second Accent Fabric:

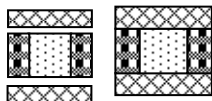
- Cut 7 strips 2 1/2" wide. Of one strip only cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 6 1/2".

Piecing - Use an accurate 1/4" seam and check your block size after each step!

1. Sew the 2 1/2" ribbon strip lengthwise to each side of the 6 1/2" main fabric strips. Press the seams toward the 2 1/2" strips.

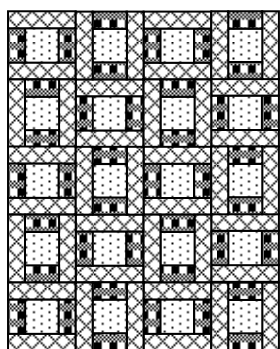
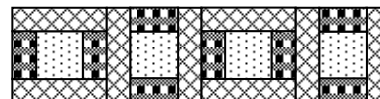


2. Cut the strips sets into 6 1/2" sections. You will need 20 units. The strip sets will produce 18 units. Use the two 6 1/2" squares and the four 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" ribbon rectangles to make two additional units.

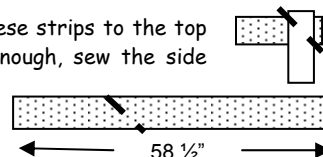


3. Sew the 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangles to the long sides of the 6 1/2" units. (If this strip does not fit exactly, check your previous 1/4" seam allowance. It may be slightly too big or too small.) Press the seams toward the rectangles. The block should measure 10 1/2" x 10 1/2".

4. Lay out the blocks in five rows with four blocks in each row. The blocks should have the long strips alternating as illustrated. Sew the blocks into rows. Press the seams toward the long strips. Join the rows and press the seams in one direction.

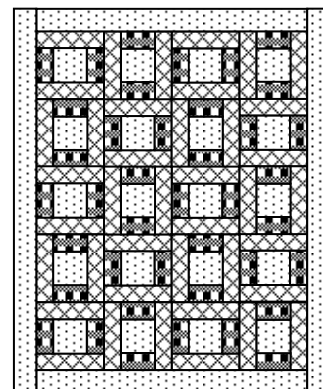


5. Measure and mark two of the border strips at 40 1/2". Sew these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top. (If the strips are not long enough, sew the side border strips first. Use the leftover strips and join it to these strips. Then measure and mark the long strips at 48 1/2" and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top.)



6. Join the two border strips with a diagonal seam. Press the seam to one side. Measure and mark the long strip at 58 1/2". (This measurement will be 50 1/2" if you need to sew on these borders before to top and bottom borders.) Sew these strips to the sides of the quilt top. Press the seams toward the border strips.

7. Layer the quilt top with the batting and backing. Baste the quilt.



8. Quilt by hand or machine. For simple machine quilting, stitch in the ditch in a grid between the blocks and on each side of the 6" center square. Be sure to use a batting that is acceptable to quilting at that distance. Start the stitching at the raw edges of the quilt so that the border will not need additional quilting. Or stitch in the ditch from border to border and add a simple cable in the border. A simple design could also be added in the center of each block.

9. Make approximately 230" of bias binding. Apply the binding to the raw edges on the front of the quilt and then turn the binding to the back. Stitch the binding in place.

10. Don't forget to add a label and pass on the quilt with love.
